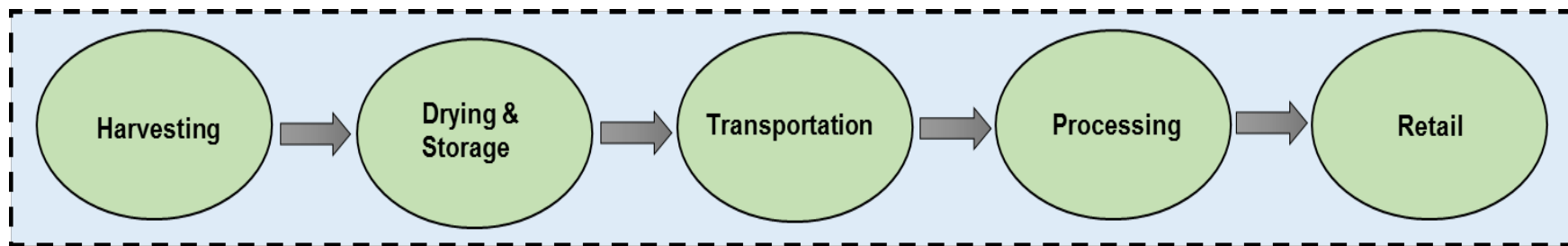

Question 2: For each of two most critical TIAs, what are/could be the 3-5 best practices and/or most promising approaches?

Question 3: For the two most critical TIAs and the approaches identified in Q. 2, what is needed to implement these solutions with significant impact?

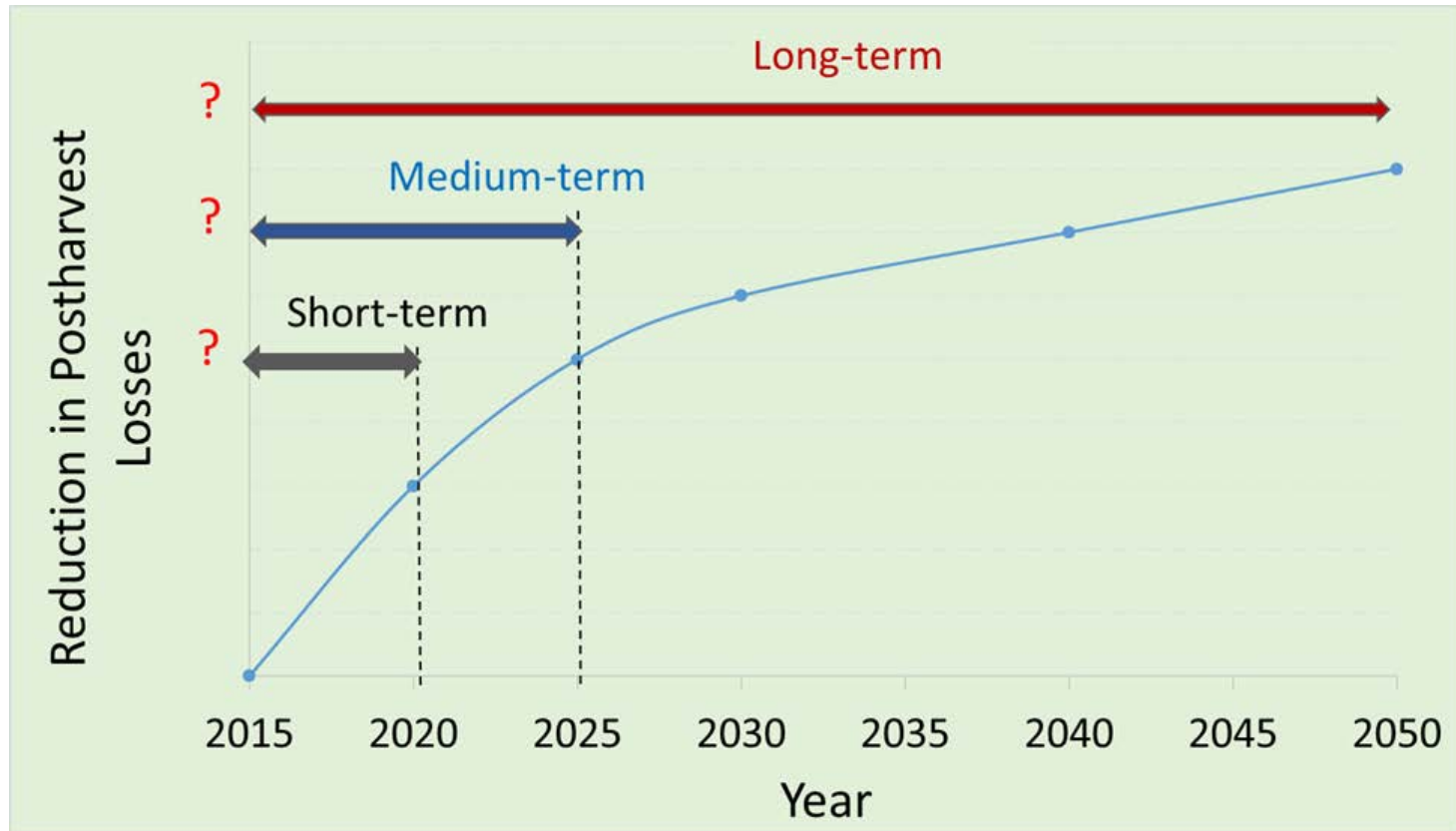
Question 4: Based on answers to the above questions, by how much can postharvest losses be reduced by 2050 to improve the quality of lives and livelihoods of a large number of smallholder farmers?

Question 5: List 5-7 key areas or messages that were not discussed or addressed in this Congress but are needed to sustainably reduce postharvest losses with minimal environmental impact (For complete supply chain).
